

Stop the abuse of power

Fampo is an organisation which struggles against corruption and abuse of power – see our website www.fampo.no.

The world is not exactly what it looks like when you rely on mainstream media. Also in countries which are supposed to be democracies, power is abused in a manner and to an extent that should cause wide protests. At www.fampo.no/country_index.html, you can read about some not so nice conditions in several countries.

Did you for example know that in Great Britain, thousands of CCTV cameras have been put into private homes to monitor “problem families”? Or that some US schools have been using tracking devices in school badges, so that the children’s location can be monitored at any moment? Or that Norwegian authorities have used totalitarian methods against oppositionals who have disclosed corruption, including psychiatric detention, the use of the judicial system to remove the editor of a newspaper, and physical assaults? Or that one in two foster children in Sweden has been sexually abused?

Fampo’s website also covers several important topics at www.fampo.no/topics.html. One of them is history. The American historian Anthony C. Sutton has in his books documented how Wall Street was deeply involved in both the Bolshevik revolution in Russia in 1917 and Hitler’s takeover in Germany in 1933. Sutton’s books are published on the internet, and one can read them at www.fampo.no/history.html.

Another important topic is health (see www.fampo.no/health.html). In his book *World Without Cancer*, G. Edward Griffin marshals the evidence that cancer is a deficiency disease – like scurvy or pellagra – aggravated by the lack of a vitamin, vitamin B17. Not only can the vitamin prevent cancer, but it has been used with good results in cancer therapy.

This is not approved by orthodox medicine, but labelled fraud and quackery. In *World Without Cancer* Griffin explains how fraud has been used to sabotage research demonstrating the usefulness of B17 in cancer therapy. The consequence is that billions are spent each year on research and other billions taken in on the sale of cancer-related drugs, while millions of people die needlessly.

At www.fampo.no/Org2.html, Fampo takes a closer look at some groups, people and institutions which claim to further human rights or fight against conspiracies. With real opposition, corrupt and oppressing regimes will face trouble. Unfortunately, it turns out that the well known “human rights organisations” are silent when it comes to documented human rights violations in countries which are described as democratic, and thereby whitewashing regimes which should be exposed. And unfortunately, many of the groups which claim to disclose and fight conspiracies (and in some cases actually provide some useful information), turn out to act in a way inconsistent with real opposition.
